Undergraduates Rising as Leaders

e welcome you back for this spring 2002 edition of *Tau Tales*. The Chapter has undergone many changes with the new year, but many of the old traditions still remain. In December, we sent off two long-time brothers, Thomas Ho and last year's president, Ryan Betters, to find their life's work. However, we gained seven new members who are already assuming leadership positions within the brotherhood. These men accumulated a grade point average higher than the overall Chapter average during their pledge period. The Chapter now has over 40 undergraduate brothers.

The advent of a new semester brings several new statistics regarding Tau's place among fraternities at Penn State. I am pleased to announce that once again we have achieved a GPA higher than the all-fraternity and alluniversity averages, and currently rank 14th of 55. Also important to note are our 12 brothers who earned a place on the dean's list with a GPA above 3.50, nearly double the number from last semester.

On February 22, The Interfraternity Council/ Panhellenic Dance Marathon raised \$3,613,178 for the Four Diamonds Fund, topping last year's record of \$3,609,830 by almost \$3,500. This year, Delta Tau Delta and Chi Omega landed a whale of a sponsor with Tommy Hilfiger. In addition to donating money, they also provided our dancers with clothing for Dance Marathon weekend. As of February 7, we collected close

to \$60,000. Our final total was \$72,694, surpassing our high of \$72,000 from last year! Dancing this

year from the brotherhood were be THON chair Owen Salerno '02, Zac Gilbert '02, Chi Tsui '04, and me. Amit Patel '02 was operations captain.

Another exciting improvement soon to be added to the Shelter is a broadband Internet connection. Gone will be the days of tying up phone lines and waiting on dial-up connections. Thanks to the work of Tau Housing Corporation, we will be installing our own high-speed LAN network within the house, allowing all brothers to share their notes, music, movies or whatever they please with everyone else. Speaking of technology, our fall pledge class recently completed an amazing pledge project. Having always had the problem of having to set up a stereo, speakers, amp, etc., whenever we had a social event, they were able to wire several speakers throughout the Shelter, both in the basement and on the ground floor. These are then all connected to a new 5-CD disk changer and receiver in a locked cabinet they installed behind our main bar.

We are all looking forward to seeing as many alumni as possible within the next few months. There is a newfound respect for the house, and with the transfer of Alex Reich from the Illinois Institute of Technology, our Ritual and ceremonies have been resurrected, with all new equipment and robes. We hope this will all come together to make Tau Chapter the dynamic group of men it once was. If you don't believe us, come out and see for yourself. We
