Alumni Q & A with David Mooney '61

WRITING A CHECK IS THE EASY PART

In life, there are very few times when you can say, "100%." David Mooney '61 can.

One of them made a connection at Delt, and the three of us were rushed together.
R.L. was later killed in Vietnam.

Tell us about your favorite memory of the fraternity.

We had some pretty fantastic parties. And we used to dress up for dinner with a tie and sports coat. It was there that I learned social graces that put me in good standing as I went on in life. I remember that one of our pledge brothers, **David Erwin '61**, was referred to as a crustacean for putting his elbows on the table.

What kind of influence has the fraternity had on your life since graduation?

I was the president of DTD while I was there. This was one of the first experiences I ever had in leadership, managing a budget and basically worrying about things other than myself. It was a fantastic experience that doesn't often happen to young people. I learned how to deal with people.

With whom do you still stay in contact?

I stay in touch with **David Dunn '61**, Dave Erwin and **Jim Thompson '62**. And as a class agent, I am in contact with others regarding fraternity business — brothers like **Bob Schimmel '60**, Tim Phillips, Jim King and others.

Tell us about your family life.

I have two daughters. One daughter is an attorney in Las Vegas. The other owns her own business in Connecticut. There are seven children between the two of them. My wife, Linda, and I are both retired. We spend a lot of time at our home in Maine. It is there where I enjoy bird hunting, fly-fishing and golf.

Did you have a nickname?


Moon, of course!

Dr. Layng served Tau during the reinstallation of the chapter in 1978 through the difficult years following the 1980 fire that virtually destroyed the Shelter but not the Tau spirit. He was a 1957 graduate of

Meadville High School and a 1961 graduate of DePauw University where he was a member of the Beta Beta Chapter of Delta Tau Delta. He furthered his education with a graduate degree from the University of Pittsburgh School of Dental Medicine in 1965.

Dr. Layng served two years of active duty in the U.S. Navy Dental Corps and four years of active reserve that included tours of duty in Vietnam, the Philadelphia Naval Hospital and in Newport, R.I. He was awarded a Purple Heart and two Bronze Stars as well as a Presidential Citation during his service. From 1969 until his death, he was the founding partner and dentist at Layng, Senior and Associates, in State College.

In addition to his volunteer work with Tau Chapter, Dr. Layng was very generous with community services, and he enjoyed sailing, skiing, creative writing, music, travel and his professional continuing education activities. He is survived by two sons, Kenneth M. Layng of Boalsburg and Robert C. Layng of Zambia, Africa. Tau Chapter is very grateful for Dr. Layng's service to our fraternity.
