APPEARANCE DOES MATTER

ALUMNI BROTHERS NEEDED TO STEP UP TO HELP REPAIR SHELTER'S CONDITION TO PRESERVE OUR FUTURE

Greetings everyone and hope this edition of *Tau Tales* finds all of you healthy and ready for the holiday season. Yes, we have decided to go back to providing a printed, mailed version of *Tau Tales* instead of the email version that we have been publishing. Please enjoy the content, the news and updates of the great things the actives are achieving including a huge pledge class which is currently in process. The latest chapter officers are tremendous in their efforts and love of the Shelter.

This report is about something serious, the Shelter's condition. It is, quite frankly, just hanging in there. There is no other way to state it. Giving is at an all-time low, and we are barely covering our costs to maintain the Shelter. We received approximately \$15,000 total in contributions last year. Yes, that's it. In comparison, I note that Sigma Chi received \$2 million. The funds we did raise are appreciated and much thanks to the alumni that are supporting the Shelter, but funds don't last long when you have to maintain a three-story house filled with 35 to 45 actives.

Because of the inability to upgrade facilities and improve the finishes and materials of the Shelter on a more regular basis, it affects the ability for the actives to attract new members and therefore affects our future. Appearance does matter. The recent Library renovations, which are fantastic and being used daily by the actives, were done using funds from the Educational Fund, coupled with the sweat equity of the brotherhood. Otherwise we would have had difficulty funding this effort. We have not had the ability financially to perform any major upgrades, and the actives are deservedly requesting projects for improving the Shelter such as renovating the living/Chapter room to reflect the new furniture, updating the basement to be the entertaining

space, updating the kitchen equipment and installing new windows for upper floors and new carpeting for the 2nd and 3rd floor hallways.

This leads me to my next plea. **Larry Hixson '81** has stepped up big time this year and is now chairing our fundraising efforts. Larry will be taking over as Communications Director from **Drew Chappie '03** by the end of this year as well. By now you have received a letter from Larry asking for your financial support in great detail, and you should have received a Tau Delt sticker to proudly display on your car. His letter did result in a surge of giving. Thank you.

In the near future we will offer a way for you to help in a small way that will add up via a direct debit micro-transaction. I am sure most of you could part with \$5, \$10 or \$20 a month having it direct debited from your checking account. I know I can, and I will. When this program is rolled out later this fall, please sign up, forgo that one fancy cup of coffee on Friday, and give the money instead to DTD each month, as it is desperately needed. Smaller dollars will add up to real funds that can be used for real improvements. If 100 brothers donate \$20 per month, that is \$2,000 per month or \$24,000 for the year. Wow, what a difference that would make!

What's new at the Shelter, and how you can help hands on

The good news regarding the Shelter: we were able to get the 2nd and 3rd hallways repainted, and we had to buy a new refrigerator (the old one died and could not be repaired any longer). Tau Corporation bought new living room furniture including end tables, couches and rugs and new dining room chairs. As of this

writing, all of this material should be in place at the Shelter. We plan on finding a way to replace the carpeting in the 2nd and 3rd floor halls, one way or another. It will cost about \$3,500. Is there anyone out there that can donate this money to make this happen?

I want to close with another plea: we need volunteers. Our current board is composed of nine members, listed on page 1. All are working hard and contributing their time despite their busy lives and careers. They are giving

back to something that gave so much to them.

Drew Chappie has asked to step down from his board position and with great sadness we have accepted. To me, Drew is “Mr. Delt,” and has worked long and tirelessly for all things Delt. We will miss Drew’s participation. The good news is he is getting married next year! **Craig Emery ’84** has been on the board via long distance and would gladly give up his role to someone more local as well. WE NEED VOLUNTEERS! Now


